Having grown up in a religious home and spending a season as a hippie wannabe, I came to Christ a couple weeks before my 17th birthday. Professor John Piper deeply influenced me while a student at Bethel College. After studying at Fuller Seminary, my 40-year ministry at Bethlehem Baptist Church began. Eighteen of those years were spent as Pastor for Missions and Leadership Development. This was followed by another two decades of teaching and mentoring in The Bethlehem Institute which, to our surprise and delight, evolved into Bethlehem College & Seminary.

I have accepted the position of Director of Theological Education in Cameroon, Central Africa.

Bethlehem Baptist Church has appointed me as a global partner with Training Leaders International as my sending agency, an agency which was birthed out of Bethlehem over a decade ago.

The process has begun in earnest to raise my prayer and financial support, hoping to transition to TLI as soon as possible. No reason to drag one's feet when the 65th birthday has come and gone! I plan to give the next 5 years of my life to this effort. Then, if the Lord wills, I will re-commit for the next five years.

The 7 block walk east to Bethlehem is about to become a 10 block westward walk to the TLI headquarters in downtown Minneapolis. The current plan is to spend 20-25% of my time on site in Yaoundé, the capital of Cameroon. A major part of my efforts will be to recruit, train, and serve with like-minded laborers. Partnering with Cameroonian leaders we hope to stimulate a Cameroonian led church-planting/church-revitalizing movement which has in its DNA theological education and outreach to the least reached peoples of Cameroon and beyond.

The strategy for accomplishing this goal is to recruit, train and mobilize godly Cameroonian leaders in a way that empowers without creating dependency and results in true multi-ethnic worship of our triune God. I am summarizing this ministry as "Ministry of the Word: Exponential Multiplication."




